# **Signs of Hope** by Pastor Barbara

As I sit down to write this article, the long dreary afternoon turned very dark, and a cold rain moved in suddenly, beating against the window. The moment seemed to me like a reflection of the drumbeat of news I had been reading—wars rage, divisions deepen, injustices persist. Sometimes, it's hard not to wonder, "Where is God in the midst of all this?"

In search of a bit of good news, I found some video that caught my attention. The NASA astronauts had made a safe landing in a SpaceXDragon in the water off the coast of Tallahassee, Florida on March 18. The trip was a source of worry, after what was an extended stay at the International Space Station because of technical challenges.

The safe splashdown in the ocean was beautiful to behold, but then as I watched, something truly magical happened. Dolphins came to play around the spacecraft to welcome the astronauts home! Just as each of the crew boarded the recovery ship, one, then two, then three dolphins danced around them, and soon a whole pod joined in.

A friend with Native American heritage explained to me recently that dolphins are often understood to be a sign of divine protection as well as a symbol of transformation and renewal. In a word, dolphins are a sign of hope.

In the gospels, hope is not wishful thinking. And for followers of Jesus, hope is the story of God's great renewal project, which continues to ground us in the certainty of what God has already done and what He has still promised to do.

This season of Lent, we have followed Jesus through many dark moments on the way to the cross. Paul writes to the church at Corinth, and tells them if Christ has not been raised, our faith is in vain (1 Corinthians 15:14). But Christ has been raised! The resurrection of Jesus is not just an isolated miracle—it is the beginning of God's new creation. It is the signpost that tells us the darkness is already being overcome, and that the long, cold winter of sin and death is giving way to spring.

Our task as believers is to live now in light of that coming reality. Every act of kindness, every march for justice, every moment spent in worship is a declaration that the darkness is already receding, and the dawn of God's kingdom is near. The cold storm will not last forever, the light has already begun to shine. The risen Christ leads us forward. For we are Easter people, reflecting the light and embodying hope until the day when this world is fully and finally made new. Invite a friend on April 20, and let's celebrate that Easter hope together!

Recently, a master gardener offered to take up the challenge to restore the garden. Unfortunately, all attempts have been unsuccessful. The success of a beautiful garden is planting the proper plants, watering as needed, and regular maintenance. And of course, prohibiting the deer from making it their lunch. This has been and continues to be the challenge we face.

To sustain a successful garden requires much time and work. On Saturday, April 26<sup>th</sup> at 9am, volunteers from Lehigh University's action team, coordinated by Celia, will join our volunteers to work together in the labyrinth.

## **Attention Graduating High School Seniors & Post High School Students**

If you are a graduating high school senior and an active member of the church, you may apply for the Jack H. LaFever Memorial Achievement Award. Jack was a life-long member of First UMC who died in a car accident in 1986, at the age of 23. Selection is based on church and community service, scholastic achievement and extracurricular activities. You do not have to be considering post high school education to be eligible for the Award.

Church members planning to enroll or continue in college, vocational or technical school, or those who are currently enrolled, and need help with the cost of furthering their education, should apply for an interest-free loan from the church's Educational Assistance Fund. Loans are based on the availability of funds and must be repaid in full.

Applicants for this Award & loans must be active church members. Applications may be picked up in the church office or from Alex Konya (<u>alexander.s.konya@lmco.com</u>) and must be returned to the church office no later than **Thursday, May 1**<sup>st</sup>, **2025.** 

## **Looking for New Committee Members**

The **Educational Assistance Committee** is looking for new members. The Committee started in the 1970's at First UMC when the members of the Wesley Class decided to help students from the church with their higher education expenses. Over the years, the Committee has helped over 45 church members by lending close to \$100,000 in interest-free loans. Loans can be used for college, vocational or technical school classes.

The Committee also administers the Jack H. LaFever Memorial Achievement Award, a scholarship given to a deserving member of Green Pond UMC who is graduating from high school. The Award has grown from \$100 at its inception to \$1,000 annually. The Committee has awarded 30 Memorial scholarships, totaling \$25,950. The LaFever Fund has also been used to help the church's youth with donations of game and sports equipment, money towards youth retreats and VBS.

The Committee currently consists of Alex Konya (Chairman), Jill Moulthrop, Diana Gerbino, and Barbie Lewis. We would like some new members to join us. We usually meet once a year, in May, to discuss our finances and discuss/vote upon loan and Award applications.
